The Piggy glass jug by Aldo Cibic delightfully rotund form was first exhibited in 2000 at the Aperto Vetro exhibition, in Museo Correr, Venice. Not only would it add a touch of playfulness to any table, it makes a lovely vessel for serving water or even sangria.

# Host in Elegance

Winner of the Wallpaper Design Award 2011 as best carafe of the year, designed by Aldo Cibic the Foxy silver plated carafe has a narrow neck that curves gracefully into itself, making it ideal for filtering everything from ice to fruit slices. Pair these distinctive containers with the Phil copper-finished brass tray to bring more sparkle and shine to the table. Designed by Bijoy Jain, Phil exudes a rustic boldness. Its gentle curves juxtaposed by a long T-handle, makes it a truly refined serving of individual expression.

### Luminous Brilliance

Expect no less than creative genius from Spanish designer, Jaime Hayon. His El Palo candleholder is a boldly modern take on a traditional decoration. Crafted from stainless steel and made to hold up to 30 candles, it illuminates any gathering from a convivial reunion of friends, to a romantic night with a loved one. A gentler but no less

unique touch can be found in the Ambra candlesticks by Aldo Cidic, which come in low, medium and large variations and are crafted from hand blown glass by Venetian master glassblower, Massimo Lunardon.
